CaFa was organized in 1997 to further the cultural ties between the sister cities of New York and Tokyo by encouraging and honoring the creativity of their clay artists. All ceramists from New York and Tokyo are invited to enter the competition.

Eminent judges including Toshio Ohi, the 10th Generation Ohi Potter; David McFadden, Chief Curator of Museum of Arts & Design; Shinichi Doi, former conservator, The Metropolitan Museum; Cora Rosevear, Associate Curator, Museum of Modern Art; Professor Miyeko Murase, Takeo and Itsuko Atsumi Professor Emerita, Columbia University and former Special Consultant for Japanese Art at The Metropolitan Museum; T. Richard Fishbein Partner Emeritus, Cortec Group will select winning pieces from 100 of the finest works, 50 from New York and 50 from Tokyo. An exhibition of the selected pieces will be presented at The Nippon Gallery at The Nippon Club from October 18 to October 22, 2011. The reception and award presentation ceremony will be held on Friday, October 21, 2011 from 6 p.m. Prizes will be awarded for outstanding works. Each entry will be judged for its aesthetics, creativity, originality, and technical skill. First Place Grand Prize winner will receive a round trip ticket from New York to Tokyo contributed by All Nippon Airways.

We look forward to seeing you and your artwork that will bring New York and Tokyo’s sister city affiliation even closer.

How to Enter

Application deadline: September 30, 2011 (Friday)

Selection for the exhibition will be conducted from photographs (slides or digital photo images on CD's will not be accepted). Only printed photographs (digital or otherwise) will be accepted for consideration. No submissions via email. Only 1 entry can be submitted per artist. The exhibits are limited in size to a maximum of 18 inches (45 cm) in any dimension.

To enter, please send photographs of your artwork, completed application form, an entry fee and a self-addressed stamped envelope.

You will be notified if your work has been accepted for exhibition. We will inform you as to where and when your exhibition piece should be delivered at that time.

Photographs

Photos must be printed in a standard image size (4X6, 5X7 or 8.5X11 inches). Please indicate your name and the title of the artwork on the backside of the photographs. Your submission materials will NOT be returned. Therefore, please be sure to make a copy of your submission materials.

Entry Fee

There is a nonrefundable entry fee of \$30 per artist. Please make check payable to the Ceramic Artist Friendship Association, Inc. Please indicate your name on the check.
